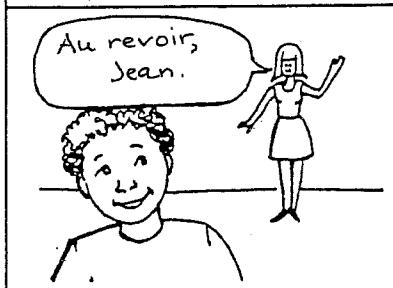

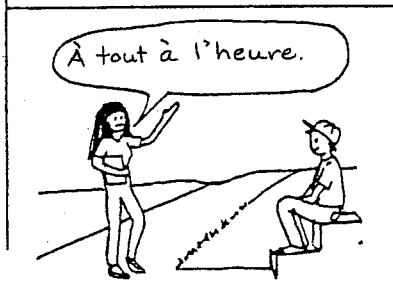

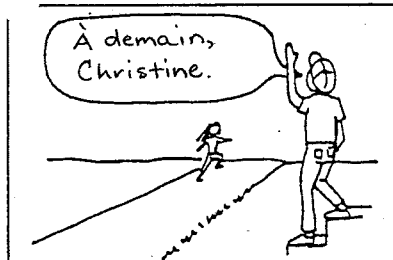

What's your name?

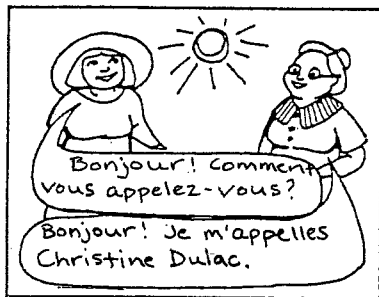

In French there are two ways to ask "What's your name?" **Comment vous appelez-vous?** is more formal. It uses the word **vous**, a polite form of the word "you." **Vous** is usually used with someone you don't know very well or who is older than you.

The second way, **Comment t'appelles-tu?**, is less formal. It uses the word **tu**, a familiar form of the word "you." **Tu** is usually used with someone you know very well (a family member or close friend), someone younger than you, or a pet.

The answer, **Je m'appelle . . .** (My name . . .) is used to answer both styles of questions.

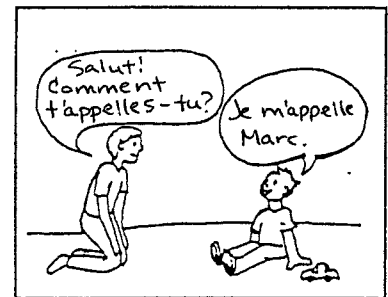
